We are closing in on our next, whole-congregation interim task:  
“harvesting” our history!

As most of you remember our **Six Interim Tasks** are:

- 1= Harvesting our History
- 2= Discerning current Identity and Vision
- 3= Nurturing our connection to the Larger Church [PCUSA]
- 4= Leadership Development: permission, training and nurture
- 5= Preparing for New [installed] Pastoral Leadership
- 6= Increasing the ‘spiritual temperature’ of our congregation

And, the **Mile Stones of our Interim Work** are:

- ~ departure of previous installed pastor & arrival of interim pastor
- ~ Session forms **Interim Ministry Team**. Ours is: Melba Read, Janice Zanders & Robert Rogers
- ~ **Getting to Know You Time**: typically the first 9 months or so; whatever time it takes for a congregation to accept me as their ‘real’ [though temporary] pastor. We’re well ahead on this milestone, I believe.
- ~ **Town Hall Meetings** focused on letting go of recent emotional and spiritual ‘artifacts’ that may impair our ability to look at our history and discern God’s current leading.
- ~ **Harvesting our History**: more on this in a moment! We’re HERE at this point in our process ... though Tasks 3-6 go on from the beginning through to the end of the congregation’s work, in varying ways.
- ~ Current **identity and vision discernment**: the other major, whole-congregation Interim Task!
- ~ **Leader Training and Development**: this is already operating in varying ways
- ~ Preparing for **new Pastoral Leadership**: This also goes on from the very beginning, but we will take concrete steps along the way, so that your installed pastor has the best possible chance of bonding well with you and creating a felicitous, durable and effective collaboration to achieve the ministry brought into clear focus during the identity and vision discernment work. This also includes electing the Pastor Nominating Committee [PNC], and writing the Ministry Information Form [the church’s ‘resume’ with which to seek your installed pastor.]
- ~ **Search period ...**

~ PNC presents their chosen candidate for your next, installed, long-term ... Pastor!

So, I believe we are coming along in our tasks well and effectively with one another.

As I said, we are beginning the next, whole-congregation task: **“Harvesting” our History.**

At the core, this is a time for us to reflect on the history of FPCR, asking God to speak to us about what we are to take into our future, and to show us the lessons we may learn from some of the tough times this church has been through.

I’m very glad for the varying events the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Team has put together so far, and the displays of historical events and stories. This week I had a lovely conversation with the Rev. Dr. Wes Scholtzhauer, which I will relate to you all in due course. What I’m trying to say is that we’re already focused and working in useful ways to seek answer to the core question I posed above.

You all may have noticed the 20’ sheet on the tables against the south wall of our Fellowship Hall. That is our **Time Line**. You will see the detail grow as the Interim Ministry Team [IMT] puts more and more of our historical events on that line.

I invite any of you to let me or the members of the IMT know what events you find significant, and we’ll place them on the Time Line!

Also, soon, you will be asked to put your own, personal First-Presbyterian-Church-SIGNIFICANT-EVENTS on the Time Line! So, be prayerfully remembering what this church, its people and pastors have meant to you and this community.

We will call another Town Hall Meeting late this month, or early in December to reflect and celebrate together, seeking God’s leading concerning our history. In this manner I believe we will ‘harvest’ useful notions to guide us into our future!

I’ll close with a clarification. I’ve been asked which month I’m leaving to be with Lucia in Florida and which month she will be here. I guess I didn’t write that clearly. We’ve found that when we are serving churches far apart, that we do well enough when we find several days a month when we can visit each other. One month, say, I’ll go to Florida, and the next, Lucia will visit here. So, both churches have their pastors full-time [well, except for the vacation days we take to be with each other ... :-)

So, please keep us, your leaders and our churches in your prayers! [The church Lucia is serving is Brandon FPC.]
