Pastor Nominating Committee

& Future Process

From our *Book of Order:* G~2.0802: "The Session shall call a congregational meeting to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee that shall be representative of the whole congregation. The committee's duty shall be to nominate a pastor for election by the congregation."

I'm writing this on Thursday, June 19. I received an email last evening from our Presbyter, the Rev. Melana Scruggs, letting Cynthia Hobart and I know the Committee on Ministry of John Calvin Presbytery has authorized us to proceed to elect our PNC.

Our Session acted last Monday, June 16th in anticipation of a positive outcome, calling a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, July 6th, following worship. At that meeting, Cynthia will present the slate of folks who have said 'yes' to Session, that they would serve, if elected.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ, here at Rolla FPC, it will be your duty and joy to elect this slate, or modify it according to your collective wisdom.

So that you may be thinking and praying about your action, the slate of persons who have said they would be willing to serve on the PNC are: Lee Bennett, Pam Cottingham, Rob Heberer, Ken Kwantes, Bob May, Susan Murray and Jan Roberts.

If elected, this Committee [or the one constituted by your vote] will begin working immediately. Presbytery will send a resource person to help them get working, and I've had some experience in coaching the beginning work of a number of PNCs. We will hold an orientation/training time to help them find their plan and process.

Their first major task will be to write and enter online our Ministry Information Form, or "MIF" in acronym. This will be our church's 'resume' with which the PNC will search for your next, long-term, pastor. As soon as the MIF is active, the search begins.

Please feel free to bring any suggestions or thoughts to our PNC, preferably in writing. However, know from the beginning that they are to operate with autonomy and confidentiality until such time as they have a chosen candidate to present to our congregation to elect, or not, as your next, long-term, pastor.

Please be regular and passionate in your prayers for their discernment! your temporary shepherd, John

The mission committee is kicking off a new hands-on mission called "Yarning for God". The purpose is simple; we are going to make handmade items for the women and children at Russell House. Women and children served by Russell House are on a difficult journey from verbal, emotional, physical, and/or sexual abuse to a new life with hope and opportunity. As they make this difficult journey we want to wrap them in God's love and our prayers. We want to do this symbolically (and practically) by providing the women and children with handmade yarn goods and our prayers. The members and friends of the church are invited to knit, crochet, or sew handmade items such as hats, scarfs, baby blankets, stuffed toys, and mittens.

Since males and females of all ages are supported by Russell House, crafters can make items of varying colors, sizes, and styles. Crafters of all skills and techniques are welcome to participate. A written message of love and support, along with our prayers, will be attached to each handmade item.

We will have some crafting times at the church when folks can work on their projects and visit. If you would rather work on something at home that is fine too. More details will be announced later in the summer, but in the meantime, if you have questions please feel free to contact Susan Murray.

We are now in the season of Pentecost, a time of growth in our faith and our relationship with God and with our church. Growth happens in many ways: through study, through mission service, through evangelism, and through worship. Many thanks to those who make our worship services meaningful year-round.

Services? Yes, we now have two services a week. Our traditional service is still 9:45am on Sundays. Our new service is FIRED UP! Held **Thursdays at 6:30pm**, this is an informal worship experience that lasts about a half-hour. We normally meet in the fellowship hall; in July, we will meet in the chapel on the 10th due to facility conflict with the Piece & Plenty Quilt Guild. Most likely, we will meet in the chapel twice in August due to facility conflicts. No matter—the service is the same, an informal time of music, prayer, and reflection on the Word. A member of the congregation gives a reflection on the same scripture that the pastor will use on the coming Sunday. If you would like to know more, please ask me, or just come join us and try it out.

In other news, we are **short on ushers**. As best I know, there are three (out of five) teams that are short. If you would like to get involved in this key aspect of our worship, please contact me, or contact one of the usher captains: Rob Heberer, Dean Sletten, Melba Read, Marilyn Schmidt, and Eugene Zanders. Each team serves once per month (except the fifth-Sunday team, which only serves quarterly when there are five Sundays in the month).

There are many other ways to get involved in worship. There are **sign-up sheets** outside the church office for some of them, to assist those responsible for filling the roles. Each Sunday, we need a worship leader (recruited by Dixie Finley) and someone to work the sound system (managed by Jan Roberts). On communion Sundays, we also need a six-person team to serve communion (also recruited by Dixie, choosing first among active elders but any ordained

deacon or elder may serve). During the summer, we have special music each week (coordinated by Jeff Sandquist). Come fall, chancel choir and bell choir will be starting up again. For FIRED UP! each Thursday, we need someone to play the music (usually me, but not always) and someone to give the reflection (coordinated by me).
