# How Well Do You Know Your Congregation About Myself...

I was born in Portland, Oregon a long time ago and have lived in various parts of the Northwest for over half of my life. So I consider myself an Oregonian, although I have 'done time' elsewhere. I grew up in a household with my parents and two younger brothers. After finishing high school I went to the University of Oregon, majoring in Liberal Arts, got married and went to Princeton Theological Seminary.

I have been ordained now for 56 years. Since graduation my ministry has been varied and interesting. The first fifteen years were spent serving three small parishes in Eastern Oregon and Washington. I loved these churches and being a pastor, but because of Civil Rights and the war in Viet Nam these were tumultuous years and I was in the midst of the conflict. Ur marriage ended in divorce and I entered clinical training for a year and then became a campus minister for the Universities and Community Colleges in the greater Spokane area.

The second half of my life and ministry can be traced through a series of open doors. First, when my university campus board informed me that after eight years of ministry I was entitled to a sabbatical. This enabled me to enter a year of clinical residence in Omaha. Then a small remittance from my parent's estate gave me the means to go to Berkeley, California for a year of post graduate residence in Psychoanalysis, after which I was certified as a Supervisor of Clinical Pastoral Education. And this has been my ministry for the ensuing thirty-five years, first in Cedar Rapids, then Des Moines, Iowa, and finally here in Illinois and Missouri (on the road) so to speak. When I retired in 2003, I had the honor of emeritus conferred upon me.

Interspersed with my professional life has been much recreational enjoyment with weeklong camping and back packing treks with my sons, and mountain climbing expeditions with other mountaineers. After moving to Rolla nearly twenty years ago, I have spent much of my leisure time gardening.

My happiest ministry, besides my early parishes, has been this last one, working with small groups of health care providers in various communities. I enjoyed that ministry so much that I continued to do it for several years after retirement in 2003. My happiest time has been here in Rolla, attending this church and being part of its fellowship, and being with Linda who has been a great blessing to me. I have enjoyed shedding my 'professional garb' and being a lay-person among you. But mainly I have enjoyed the friends that I made here.

## **Taco Soup** Marian Pruitt

Several people have asked for my recipe so I am sharing it with all of you.

1-1 ½ lbs. ground beef
½ cup chopped onion
1 28 oz. can whole tomatoes
1 14 oz. can black beans
1 17 oz. can corn
1 8 oz. can tomato sauce
1 envelope taco seasoning mix
1 - 2 cups water
Salt and pepper to taste
1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

Brown beef and onion stirring until crumbly. Drain. Stir in vegetables with liquid. Add tomato sauce, seasoning mix, water, salt and pepper. Mix well. Simmer for 15 minutes. Top serving with cheese. Serve with tortilla chips. Makes 6-8 servings.

(I used 90% lean ground beef and crushed tomatoes rather than whole. I added no additional salt.)

## **Memorial Garden**

Over the past several years there have been 62 engraved Memorial Bricks and 4 (without dates) placed in the Memorial Garden in memory of church members, family members, or friends.

Each spring orders are taken for the Memorial Bricks. The orders are sent to the Acme Brick Company for engraving (this process takes approximately 6-8 weeks). In the fall the engraved bricks are placed in the Memorial Garden. Following a Sunday Worship Service the congregation is invited to the Memorial Garden for a Prayer of Dedication for the newly placed bricks.

During the next couple of months, if you wish, you may place an order for a Memorial Brick in memory of a church member, family, or friend.

The cost of the brick is \$100.00, part of which pays for maintenance of the Garden.

# **Presbyterians Cook**

This was served by Marilyn Schmidt and Pam Cottingham at the Lenten Lunch. (Marilyn said it was actually her mother's recipe.) Several people requested this soup recipe as it was delicious.

#### Crock Pot Casserole

2 large potatoes, diced

2 – 3 medium carrots, sliced

1 15 oz. canned peas, frozen peas or mixed vegetables

2 medium onions, chopped

1 ½ lbs. ground beef, browned

2 ribs celery, chopped

1 10 oz. can tomato sup

1 soup can of water

Salt and pepper to taste.

Place layers of veggies in crockpot in order as given. Season each layer with salt and pepper. Put lightly browned beef on top of celery. Mix tomato soup and water and pour into crock pot. (If making soup, add chopped tomatoes and tomato juice, so that it is more like soup.) Cover and set to low for 6 – 8 hours. May be cooked on stove top.
