For a while I have been reading through the psalms using <u>The Message</u>, a modern paraphrase of the Bible by Eugene Peterson. Recently I read Psalm 80 in which the writer cries out to God pleading for God to stop being angry, to turn back to the people and restore them. Running through the psalm there's a refrain, "God come back! Smile your blessing smile. That will be our salvation." This image has stuck with me – God smiling a blessing smile. I pray we will be renewed and so full of God's light that we will have no choice but to share a blessing smile with others.

Nobby Apple Cake

Cream together 1/4 cup oil and 1 cup sugar

Add: 1 egg 1 tsp vanilla

Sift together: 1 c flour 1/2 tsp baking soda 1/2 tsp baking powder 1/2 tsp salt 1/2 tsp cinnamon 1/2 tsp nutmeg

Add to egg mixture: Stir in 3 cups diced apples – generous measure. Pour into greased 8x8 pan. Mixture will be thick.

Bake 40 – 45 minutes in 350 degree oven.
