Out of My Mind ~ for March 2014 ponderings from Pastor John

"What's happening for the rest of the Interim?"

... or ...

"When do we get our real pastor?"

Short answer:

'When we finish our work.'

... or ... 'When we know what we are looking for.'

By the time you read this, we will have completed another of the crucial, whole-congregation events in our Interim Work: reflecting on our History: Lessons & Blessings. We gathered for a Town Hall meeting on March 2nd, and spent some time talking, praying, thinking about

what FPCR has been, and what God may be leading us to bring forward with us into God's future with us.

Since I arrived among you all in April of 2013, we have been working continuously in several specific ways and at various levels. All this, and the History Reflection will be used in the <u>most important piece of our Interim Work</u>:

the Discernment Season: "Who are we, anyway? #1"

We will gather for another Town Hall meeting on Sunday, April 6th, following worship to kick off this Season of Discernment.

Here is a *tentative* sketch of the sequence and dates for the work we will complete, so as to prepare to seek our long-term, installed pastor:

Discernment Season Kickoff: "Who are we, anyway? #1 April 6 This will be a whole-congregation Town Hall Meeting, where we will begin to consider all the pieces we have worked on, draw them together, and reflect on what that means for our common life and future. I will set the agenda for the next step: Small Group Discussion/Discernment times. These will run through and after Easter.

~ Small Group Discussion/Discernment meetings April 7—May

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These small group gatherings will be a very important part of our discernment and planning. We will talk and pray together about what we've learned so far, study a series of Biblical Texts regarding the nature of the Church of Jesus, Messiah, dream together about what God may be doing with and for us, study some current demographics of our surrounding are and see what yearnings they provoke in us, and start discussing what we might choose for a "Motto" for FPCR.

Who are we, anyway? #2 May 18 We will gather in another Town Hall meeting to hear and talk about what came

forward in our Small Group Discernment gatherings. We may work on a "Pastor's



Character and Skills Shopping List" and continue seeking a Motto and Mission Statement.

The outcomes of these three pieces of work will be written up and Session will finalize our "Discernment Document" ... we will have a bit of time to check that out as a congregation, and then Session will send that document on to the Committee on Ministry. It is very likely, if we do good work, that they will give us permission to elect our Pastor Nominating Committee, the team of folks who will seek our next, long-term, installed pastor!

Be thinking and praying about a Team of 6-9 persons who exhibit good spiritual discernment, posses a clear vision for this church, and whose judgment and skills you respect.

Congregational Meeting to elect our PNC June 8 [The PNC's first task will be to write the Mission Information Form, our church's 'resume' with which they will seek our next pastor! The PNC begins The Search!
