Out of My Mind ~ for February 2015 ponderings from Pastor John

C.H.A.N.G.E.

The Rev. Mary Wright, one of the Interim Pastors in the monthly group I try to attend regularly, recently told us the acronym: C.H.A.N.G.E

Christ has a new gift every day!

I hate change ... I suspect you do, too. And, change is on our horizon. Sometime in the foreseeable future I'll leave, and your long-term pastor will arrive. That has a measure of satisfaction to it, in view of all the hard work you have done to prepare for her or his arrival, and the hope all of you have for the future of FPCR. However, you all will experience the displacement and shift with some measure of anxiety. If you have attended the "Achieving our Desired Future" event you will have some ways to engage that change effectively and in healthy ways.

I want to broaden the focus of the change that Christ is bringing us. You have probably figured out by now that one of my favorite verses is Isaiah 43: 18: "I am even now doing a new thing! Don't you get it?!"

Do you "get" the 'new thing' that our Master Jesus is doing with and through His Church?

This week I found myself pondering the historical context of Isaiah bringing this challenging Good News to the Israelites. Their situation seemed terminal. The Babylonians had breached Jerusalem's walls, desecrated the Temple, ended [forever, but One] the Davidic Dynasty, all persons and goods of value were dispersed to far-off lands ... a way of life that had lasted 1,000 years had ended. Apparently God had abandoned the People of Israel.

Change ... where's the 'gift' in all of that?

Yet, Isaiah brings God's heart into sharp focus for the remaining faithful: "I know you; I have called you by name; I love you and will ransom you!"

Isaiah continues making clear God's heart: "Don't stay focused on the former things! Even now, I am doing a new thing! Don't you perceive it?!"

My reflections led me to think on the changes we are in the midst of in these early years of the 21st Century. In no way is the magnitude of our change like the catastrophic 'ending' Israel experienced.

Yet, it does seem as though God has abandoned the main-line denominations ... America is no longer a 'christian nation' ... racial justice and equality has not come so far as we hoped and worked for ... we're free to mention 'god' and 'spirituality' in general terms, but may come in for varying forms of "persecution" for directly advocating "Jesus, God's Messiah."

I wrote last month about the "Field of Dreams Church" no longer existing; it is not enough just to build a facility and hold excellent worship ... God seems to have abandoned that tactic ...

So, what is the "new gift" Christ brings? Do you 'get' some of where God's love, energy and focus is happening?

Inherent in the acronym: C.H.A.N.G.E. is the notion that change, itself, is a time [think: *kairos*] when God is particularly present and active. God's Holy Spirit is able to snuggle into the anxious creakings and crackings of our souls, when we are pried open a bit by the change that is forced upon us ... or, in better times, the change we bring by choice.

So, I'm encouraging you to stay attentive and curious about C.H.A.N.G.E. See if you can find the gifts Christ is bringing as we engage the changes that are before us.
