A Message from Our Pastor

Dear Friends,

Soon we will enter into a new spiritual season. Lent will move into our lives and we will move into Lent on Ash Wednesday, February 14. The fact that it falls on Valentine's Day may give some of us pause. We are more accustomed to anticipating chocolates, perhaps a loving card, a nice dinner, etc. We certainly do not think of Valentine's Day as a day of ashes, a day to remember our mortality. Alas, Hallmark does not create the liturgical calendar so this year we will observe Ash Wednesday with a simple dinner and a worship service. We spend six weeks pondering Christ's life and death, his ministry, his lessons. We will think about our need for the forgiveness and salvation he made possible. We will also think about God's great love for us demonstrated through the miracles of incarnation resurrection. While we may resist the call to reflect on our frailties and sin, I urge us to overcome that impulse. I urge us to reflect on what we cannot control so we might rely on the strength of our savior. 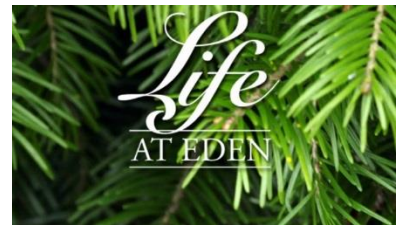

LIFE: Lifelong Learner Institute of Faith Exploration Eden Theological Seminary

Eden Theological Seminary is a United Church of Christ (UCC) seminary in St. Louis, near Webster University. They welcome people of a variety of backgrounds, but are predominantly progressive Christians. The LIFE program is for people who are looking for something more. The program meets five times a year with a basic schedule that runs from dinner Friday night through worship Saturday afternoon. Each weekend retreat includes a choice between a certificate course and an elective course. The certificate requires fifteen courses (so a minimum of three years, more if you miss one) and is intended for UCC lay leaders. I generally choose whichever course looks interesting to me, since I'm not particularly interested in a UCC certificate.

The next LIFE weekend is themed, "Jazz & Justice, Faith & Witness," and will be held on March 2-3. The format this time is different from normal to accommodate...





“Jazz for the Journey” led by Cliff Aerie and the Oikos Ensemble, Rev. Geoffrey Black, Rev. Ozzie Smith. Jazz for the Journey is an opportunity for pastors, church musicians, worship leaders, musicians, and jazz lovers to celebrate, share and explore the many possibilities of jazz as a contemporary faith language and creative vehicle for the Church’s ministry. This is the elective class.

There will also be a certificate class, “Confronting Reality: Life, Faith, Justice, Witness” with Rev. Traci Blackmon, Executive Minister of United Church of Christ Justice and Witness Ministries. This class will join with Jazz for the Journey participants in worship, meals and the concert.

A study of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, his life, work, and writings, continues in the Journey Room. All are invited to bring refreshments from Fellowship and join the discussion, which is presented in print and video by Jan Roberts. Bonhoeffer was a German pastor and theologian who was executed in the waning days of WWII because of his opposition to the Nazis and Hitler’s national church. We often think of martyrs as heroes in ancient history; this study brings to light the fact that, in some of our lifetimes, Christians were and are still suffering for our beliefs.

Beginning on February 18, Pastor Lou Ellen Hartley will lead a Lenten study in another area of the church building. Books will be ordered for those who are interested. We are experimenting with the plan of having two adult Sunday classes running concurrently.

Meanwhile, the adult Sunday school class will continue meeting in the Journey Room,

with a new study, including a video, of “Jesus, Qumran, and the Dead Sea Scrolls” beginning in late February or early March. These scrolls and fragments were discovered in 1948 by Bedouin shepherds, near the Dead Sea in what was then Jordan and is now referred to as the West Bank. Largely written during the pre-Christian era, these manuscripts contain some of the earliest known examples of the Hebrew Bible and are now housed in a dedicated museum in Israel, while scholars continue to piece together the delicate fragments.
