2022 Capital Campaign

Our church is conducting a three-year capital campaign to improve our building. Our three phases are

I) Flooring (\$30,000) - We are removing and replacing the carpet between the chapel and the sanctuary.

To save money this is being done at the same time as the preschool nursery remodel area which is covered by grants.

- II) Worship Aids (\$20,000) We would like to redo the sanctuary sound system and install a better projection system. It is important that everyone can see and hear the worship service.
- III) Safety & Security (\$30,000–40,000) The sanctuary exterior doors are heavy and don't always lock properly. We would like to replace these doors with ADA-compliant doors that can be easily opened and easily excited by someone in a wheelchair or using a walker.

We realize not everyone can give more and some are in situations where it is easier for them to give. If on average everyone was able to give an additional 40% of what they give in a year and spread that over three years, we should be able to cover all three phases. As an example, if you give \$5,000/year, 40% is \$2,000 which could be a one-time gift or \$667/year. If people can estimate what they can contribute, the session and trustees will be better able to plan.
