We were familiar with this church because we've attended many Christmas Eve services through the years.

WORSHIP & MUSIC COMMITTEE

In 2021, we reopened the church for in-person worship on Easter. I remember that I preached on Pentecost because Lou Ellen was traveling. Shortly after she returned, we learned that she was leaving to lead a congregation in Florida.

Summer/fall 2021 was a transition time. The first problem we had to solve was filling the pulpit every Sunday. We also decided it was important to have a worship leader, a role we had left vacant during the pandemic shutdown, to provide continuity when we had a visiting preacher. The second major challenge was communion. Fortunately, I had completed the Christian Leadership Program at the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary, one step in the process of becoming a commissioned ruling elder. So after a little bit of a delay, I was given approval to serve communion for our congregation.

Still, making sure worship happens every Sunday takes a huge amount of effort. I love to preach, but can realistically only handle preaching about half the time. I was pleasantly surprised when Susan Murray stepped up to preach regularly and really appreciate the different perspective she brings. I'm also grateful that Rev. Bob Morrison has once again come out of retirement to help us. But preaching is only the most visible part of the challenge.

In addition to leading our music program, Jeff Sandquist assembles the bulletin each Sunday, choosing liturgy and hymns. Jean Day was a huge help from the beginning of the transition until she rotated off the worship committee this spring. Jean scheduled pulpit supply during the most uncertain times, before we settled into a more regular rotation of preachers. It's easy to forget now how challenging things were last summer, but Jean made sure we had someone to preach and serve communion despite the uncertainties. Mary Kwantes has stepped into that role now, and Linda Rose is coordinating worship leaders.

At the back of the sanctuary, Pam Cottingham has continued to serve as primary usher after her term as worship chairperson ended. Javier Valentin-Sivico and Steve Zap are the main people working the presentation and sound board, a task that has evolved over the year.

Last August, we started the process of setting up a new live stream system, finally finished in January with our new sound board. After several iterations, we settled on a system that was effective and (relatively) easy to operate. All was well. Then on or about May 20, there was an electrical storm in Rolla that caused widespread damage at the top of our hill. That Saturday night, I went into the sanctuary as usual to verify that everything was ready for worship and discovered that the sound board was fried. Fortunately, we still have the old board and Jeff helped get our sound system back in action. That Sunday morning, I discovered that more had been damaged.

At the time of this writing, I know that the sound board is dead, the laptop has a bad HDMI port, the live stream bridge is fried, and there is at least one other problem somewhere in the video connections that needs to be found. It is unclear what, if anything, will be covered under warranty. Our insurance deductible is \$5000, which is probably higher than the value of the damage based on what we know now. Hopefully, though, it won't be too long before we're back in action. Apologies to those who have been relying on our live stream to stay connected.

One final note as I close: a word of thanks to the anonymous donor(s) who provided the Glory to God hymnals. A few years ago, we purchased a limited number for the choir as well as the projection version. I firmly believe that using the screen is the best way to sing. It promotes proper singing posture—head up instead of singing into your hymnal. However, there are a few problems with it. One, the screen is not really visible from the chancel, which is why the choir and worship leaders use hymnals. Two, we generally don't project the harmony, only the melody. Three, some people have difficulty seeing the screen due to the distance. So, we now have a limited number of Glory to God hymnals available in the narthex. If you want one, grab it on the way in, and please return it on your way out. (In case you're wondering, the old hymnals are in the coat room. I don't know what we will do with them. And if you have a particular hymn that you want included in the service, it's probably in Glory to God—talk to Jeff about getting it into the rotation. The new hymnal has about 50% more hymns than the old one, including many from the old red hymnals that were left out of the blue ones.)
