Communications Update

Over the past two years, very little has needed to be communicated with churchgoers aside from worship news. Now that we are gradually transitioning to something like normal activities, it is important to reexamine our communications processes. This is important for any committee chair or event organizer!

First and foremost, keep Katie in the loop (e.g., by sending email to <u>office@rollapresby.org</u>). That way she knows how to answer questions that arise. Also, if you are using any part of the church facility, let her know so that she can update the reservation calendar.

We have several communication channels if you want to reach everyone:

Email. Katie maintains a list of everyone who wants to receive email updates. This includes all members and many friends of the church. I get an updated list from her periodically so that I can send Friday emails about Sunday worship. If you change your email address, tell Katie!

o The prayer chain is a separate email list. Bob May (<u>carbobmay@gmail.com</u>) maintains the prayer chain and prayer list. Let him know if you need anything added or updated.

Website (https://rollapresby.org). Several people are able to post news items on the website (primarily myself, Katie, and Steve Skelton). Anything that is not *explicitly limited* to an internal audience *should be posted* on the website. That way, people don't have to dig back through their email to find information—they can just look at the website to see what offerings are being collected or what events are coming up or who to contact about various activities.

Facebook. Anything posted on the website is automatically published to Facebook. But also, you can share important information with your church family by sharing a post to our page.

YouTube (https://www.youtube.com/@rollapresby). Our live streams can be found there, if for some reason you can't find the link some Sunday morning. The live streams are all archived as well. Sometimes, the live stream doesn't work out due to technical difficulties; when possible, I post an edited video after the fact. It would help our channel ranking if you **subscribe** to our YouTube channel.

Sunday worship. Of course, we make announcements from the pulpit each Sunday morning. If you have something that needs to be announced, please tell both Jeff and me, so that it gets into the script for the worship leader and the PowerPoint for the congregation to read. If you forget and need to make a last-minute announcement, tell the worship leader, and then follow up after worship with something to post on the website and/or via email.

Whenever you have something to share, make sure to send a message that is complete and ready for broadcast. That way, we can be sure that people receive the right message just as you intend.

It's exciting that we have so much activity in the church again! Events, offerings, services, and so forth. Let's all work together to make sure that everyone can stay engaged.

Worship News

Happy Advent! We are entering one of the most special seasons of the Christian calendar. Our new year starts with the First Sunday of Advent. In the lectionary (for the preachers who use it), we are starting Year A, which centers on the Gospel According to Matthew.

Here is our schedule for Advent and Christmas:

- November 27: Pastor Greg Emery preached.
- December 4: Jonathan Kimball preaching. Communion will be served.
- December 11: Congregational meeting @11:00 to elect church officers. Susan Murray preaching.
- December 18: Christmas Cantata, "A Midnight Clear." Please note that RCAS is having their concert this weekend as well.
- December 24: Candlelight Christmas Eve service at 6:00 pm. This will be a traditional Lessons & Carols service, with readings by various parishioners and a short homily by Jean Day.
- December 25: Special Christmas Day service. **Normal time (9:45 am) but in the chapel.** Mary Kwantes will lead a service centered on Christmas carols and discussion. The intimate venue will allow people to share their thoughts, just as we did during our old Fired Up! services. We will share cookies and coffee afterwards in the lobby area.
- January 1: Jonathan Kimball preaching. Communion will be served.

At that point, we are back to normal. Also in February, we will return to the old way of serving communion. We will need elders and deacons to serve. Please be patient as we relearn how to do that.

A few words about technology. You may recall that we had a wonderful new sound board and everything was great! Until a lightning strike. I believe that we are fully recovered from the lightning damage. We have the sound board back and I have reprogrammed it. That said, things can always be improved. It is my goal that everyone can hear and fully participate in worship, whether you are in the sanctuary or not. To that end, we have hearing assistance devices, microphones on the choir, lapel mics when necessary, etc. Because I normally stay up in the chancel throughout the service, I don't really know what things sound like for the congregation, nor for remote participants. If you have any comments, please let me know.

I generally post a podcast on Sunday or Monday (depending on my availability) that has just the sermon and the scripture lesson upon which it is based. Also on Monday, I edit the YouTube archived video to trim off the beginning and end, and to add time stamps so that you can jump directly to important parts of the service. If you have any trouble with the podcasts, live videos, or archived videos, please let me know.
